"Also, avid ice chewers and those who use their teeth instead of scissors to open plastic packaging are increasing their risk of sudden dental accidents. And while precautions can be taken, accidents do happen and it's important that they are treated immediately to prevent further complications."

However, injuries aren't the only cause for dental emergencies. A simple toothache can sometimes be the culprit. "If a patient is experiencing tooth pain, that's a cause for concern. The longer a patient waits the worse the problem will become, and then there is a higher risk for permanent damage," says Dr. Mansour, dentist in Kissimmee, FL. "Pain is a sign that something is wrong and should not be ignored."
