These turtle nests can contain between 90 and 100 eggs and have been clearly marked by government entities to ensure hotel guests don't disturb the hatching, expected within 50-70 days of being laid. The turtles nest on the island every year between the months of April and August, after often having travelled half-way around the globe.
