Maldonado explains: "PPACA healthcare laws...mandate how insurance companies must legally adjudicate claims. The laws hold insurance companies accountable to the payment structures outlined in patients' health care plans."

In an evolving healthcare landscape, the importance of cogent analyses, such as Maldonado's, and companies like ANMM that use PPACA-savvy claims procedures to increase reimbursements, cannot be overstated. The payoffs of understanding PPACA, however, aren't merely, or only, financial, as Maldonado suggests in a remark that gestures towards ANMM's dual commitment to profitability and healthier patients: "When providers receive adequate reimbursement, they are...able to provide state-of-the-art care."
