

College students charged with drug crimes face significant consequences

In Texas, even the [misdemeanor possession of marijuana](#) carries harsh penalties. For possession of an amount of two ounces or less, individuals face a potential \$2,000 fine, and up to 180 days in jail. Amounts over two ounces could possibly double the jail time and fines. Possession of over four ounces could lead to felony charges, which carry extensive fines and prison time.

In addition to the legal penalties in place, college students convicted of drug crimes may face other consequences as well. These individuals could potentially be denied an ability to receive financial aid, which can make it very difficult for some students to afford to attend college. Also, most colleges have strong policies in place that lead to serious consequences for those convicted of these crimes. This includes being removed from the dorms on campus, or possibly even being expelled or suspended due to the behavior.

If you or a loved one has been charged with the possession of marijuana or other drug crime, speak to an experienced criminal defense attorney as soon as possible to begin preparing a defense to these accusations.
