The changes in marijuana laws leave many consumers confused and at risk of being arrested for a DUI, while not realizing they are breaking the law. Given the success of the legalization and regulation program in Colorado, it is likely that many states will follow suit and repeal or reduce restrictions on medical marijuana. However, at this time marijuana remains federally prohibited.

Due to the spreading legalization of medical marijuana, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration has implemented a Drug Recognition Program to help address the growing concern over [drug-related DUI offenses](#) . The program consists of trained experts who are dispatched to the crime scene to help determine the probability that the suspect is under the influence of marijuana. In these cases, while their preliminary findings can sometimes be helpful to the authorities, there is a lot of room for error and an opportunity for clients to successfully defend their case.
